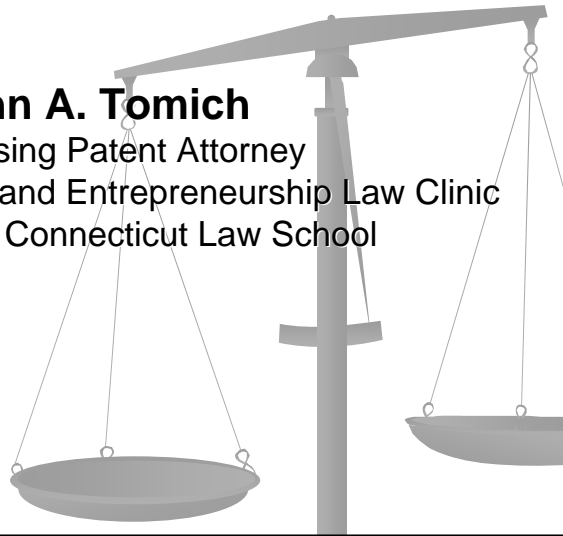

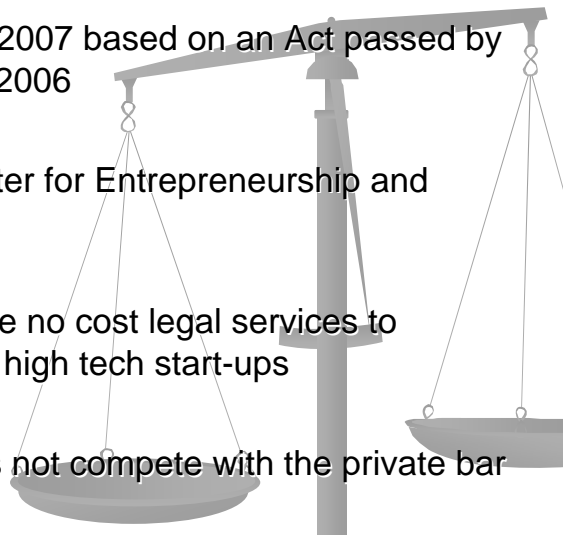

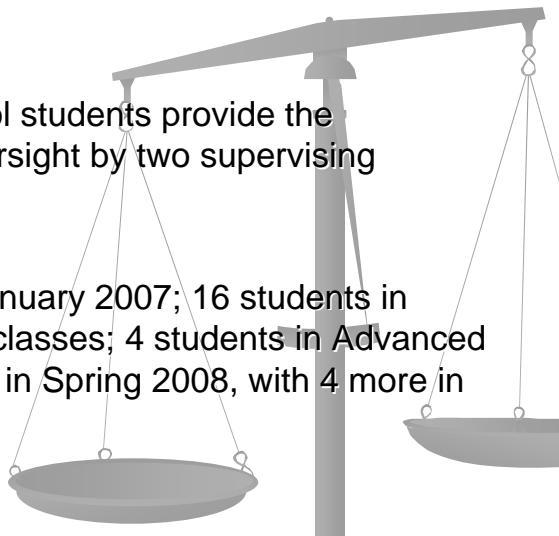
UCONN School of Law Intellectual Property and Entrepreneurship Law Clinic

- Started in January 2007 based on an Act passed by state legislature in 2006
- Part of the CT Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation
- Purpose: To provide no cost legal services to Connecticut-based high tech start-ups
- Supplements, does not compete with the private bar



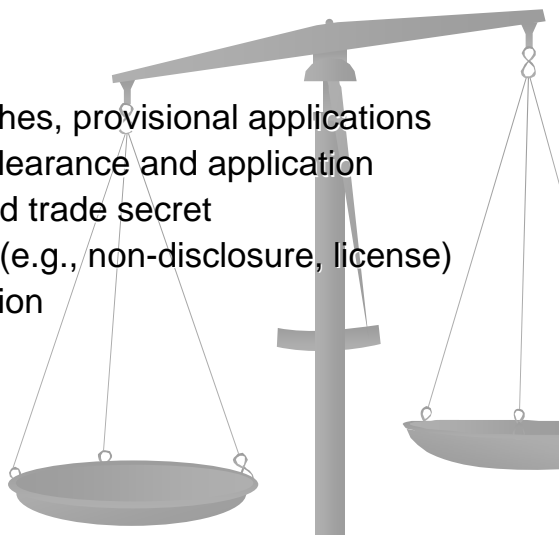
UCONN School of Law Intellectual Property and Entrepreneurship Law Clinic

- UCONN Law School students provide the assistance with oversight by two supervising attorneys
- 40+ clients since January 2007; 16 students in Spring & Fall 2007 classes; 4 students in Advanced Clinics; 10 students in Spring 2008, with 4 more in Advanced Clinic



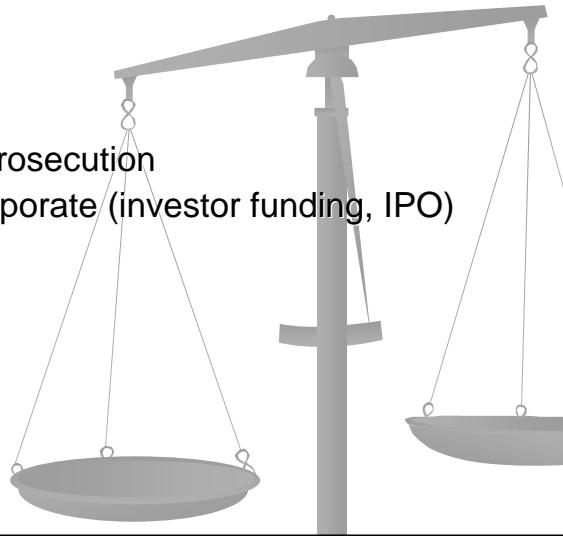

- Capabilities:
 - Patent searches, provisional applications
 - Trademark clearance and application
 - Copyright and trade secret
 - Agreements (e.g., non-disclosure, license)
 - Entity formation



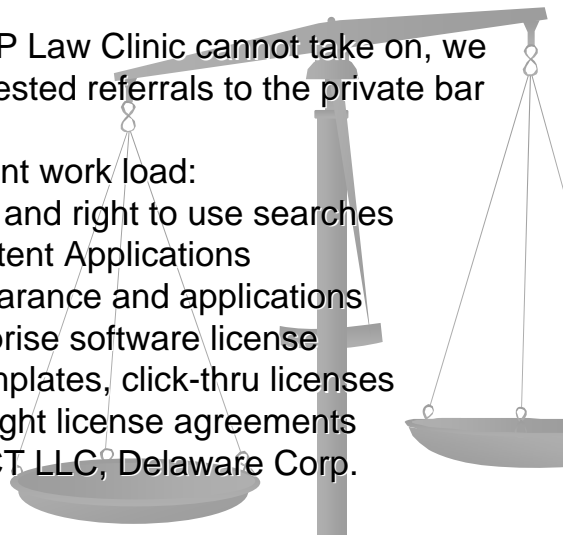

- Limitations:
 - Litigation
 - Full patent prosecution
 - Complex corporate (investor funding, IPO)
 - Financing

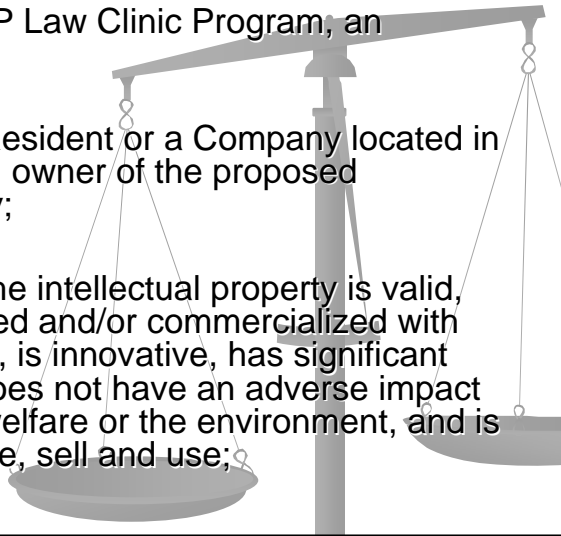
- For matters that IP Law Clinic cannot take on, we can provide suggested referrals to the private bar
- Examples of current work load:
 - Patent novelty and right to use searches
 - Provisional Patent Applications
 - Trademark clearance and applications
 - Drafting enterprise software license agreement templates, click-thru licenses
 - Drafting copyright license agreements
 - Formation of CT LLC, Delaware Corp.

To participate in the IP Law Clinic Program, an applicant must:

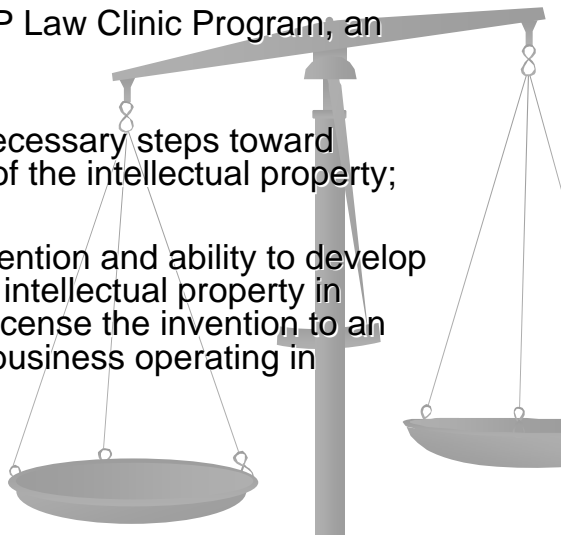
- Be a Connecticut Resident or a Company located in Connecticut and an owner of the proposed intellectual property;
- Demonstrate that the intellectual property is valid, can be manufactured and/or commercialized with existing technology, is innovative, has significant market potential, does not have an adverse impact on safety, health, welfare or the environment, and is legal to manufacture, sell and use;



UCONN School of Law Intellectual Property and Entrepreneurship Law Clinic

To participate in the IP Law Clinic Program, an applicant must:

- Diligently pursue necessary steps toward commercialization of the intellectual property;
- Demonstrate an intention and ability to develop and/or produce the intellectual property in Connecticut, or to license the invention to an existing, identified business operating in Connecticut;
